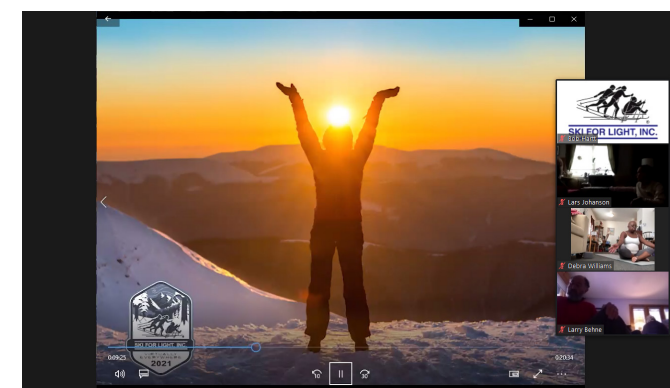
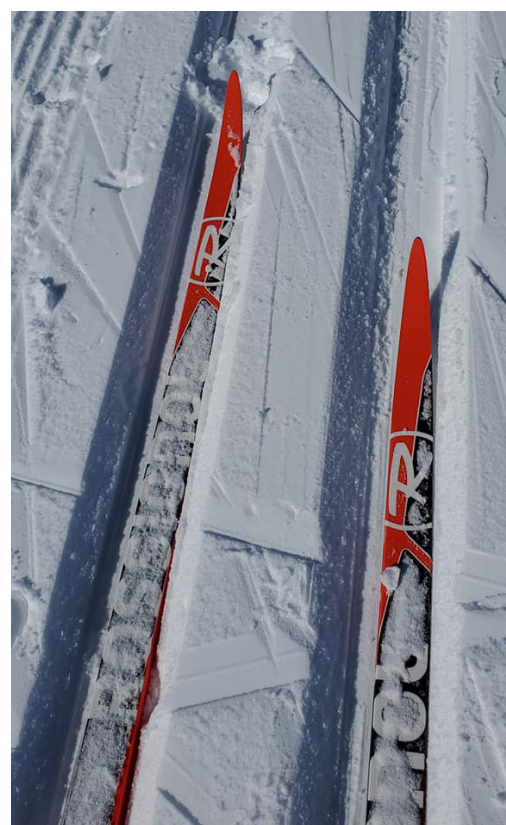

President's Letter

On July 23, 2020, the Ski for Light Board of Directors made the difficult decision to cancel the in-person 2021 Ski for Light International Week that was scheduled at Snow Mountain Ranch in Granby, Colorado. Determined to keep the spirit of SFL alive, the Board staged an alternate event, bringing our community together on the Zoom platform January 27-30. With 438 registrants, twelve special interest sessions, six fitness classes, an online auction, and opening and closing ceremonies, the 2021 virtual event boosted the spirits of participants worldwide and energized Ski for Light.

The exploits and adventures of members of the Ski for Light community have buoyed me throughout the COVID-19 crisis. In the pages of this annual report, you will discover images and anecdotes of SFL guides, skiers, and volunteers connecting with each other, creatively pursuing opportunities to be active and engaged despite the constraints of the pandemic, and enthusiastically sharing what they discovered. Also in this Annual Report, you will find Ski for Light's financial statements for fiscal year 2021. Because we did not stage an in-person International Week, we had few program-related revenues and expenses, making it challenging to compare FY 2021 to previous fiscal years. Thanks to the generous support of our foundations and corporate sponsors, the members, and lodges of the Sons of Norway, and individual donors, our fundraising results exceeded our expectations and strengthened Ski for Light's ability to plan and stage future events.

The spirit of Ski for Light is going strong, thanks to the supporters of SFL. Your commitment to our organization powers us to pursue our mission of skiing together, sharing the adventures, and learning as we go.

Program Highlights

For Jamie, the 2021 virtual event "brought back so much of what I felt and experienced during my 2018 adventure. Unfortunately, I have not had the chance to attend an SFL event since that amazing initiation. (But the heart, fire, spirit, sense of possibility, and so much more... It was all there waiting to be found again."

Ski for Light, Inc. is an **all-volunteer, nonprofit organization** founded in 1975, modeled on a similar program in Beitostølen, Norway. We have year-round offshoots across the country, but our primary endeavor is a week-long international event each winter in which blind and mobility-impaired adults are taught the basics of cross-country skiing. They leave Ski for Light with a sense of accomplishment and motivation that often carries over to their everyday lives.

- Each **visually impaired participant**

("VIP") is paired for the week with an experienced, sighted cross-country skier who acts as ski instructor and guide. The disabled person skis in tracks or grooves groomed into the snow, while the guide skis in a parallel set of tracks. The guide provides directions and skiing tips, gives encouragement, and describes the countryside. For our mobility-impaired participants ("MIPs"), who propel themselves in sit-skis, the guide might give a boost on hills and turns.

- As many as **300 people** attend each event, coming from all over the United States and from several foreign countries. Many wish to become more physically active and fit, and to find recreational opportunities that are lacking at home.

- The **volunteer guides** pay the same

event fees as disabled skiers. Their motivation is simple: to share a favorite activity with someone who would otherwise not have the opportunity to participate. Most of these guides discover that in the process of giving of themselves, they are getting more in return. Many come back year after year.

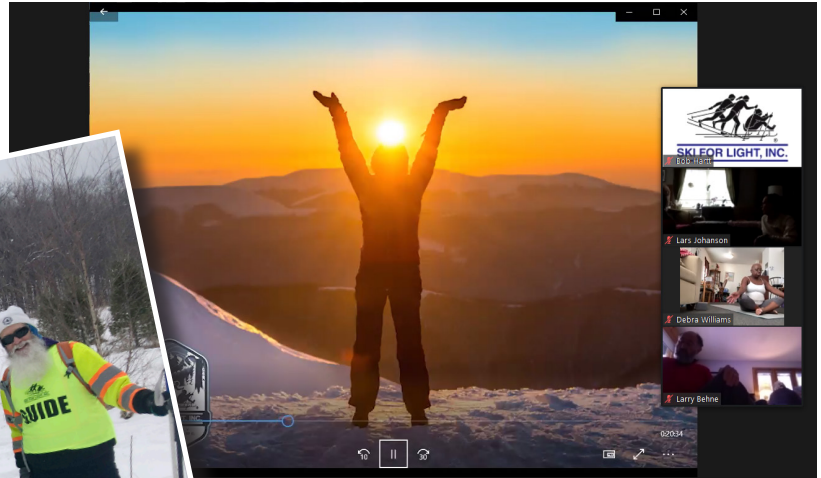
- The **event location** changes in an effort to spread the Ski for Light concept to as many parts of the country as possible. In recent years we have gathered in Casper, Wyoming; Tahoe Donner, near Truckee, California; Bellaire, Michigan, and Granby, Colorado (our 2023 event location). Our last two events were held virtually, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The shift to online programming forced us to master new tech skills, and to pursue our mission more creatively and expansively. It also made Ski for Light more accessible and inclusive than ever.

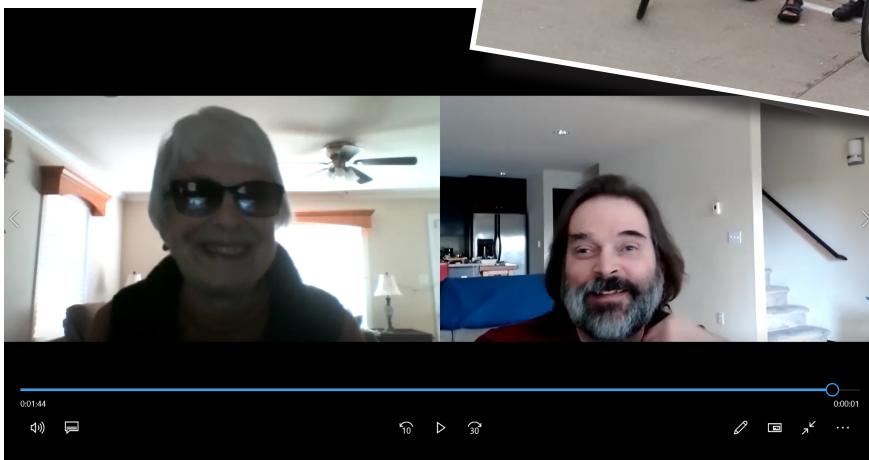

Participants set fitness goals for the week and shared their successes at our closing celebration, headlined by music legend Jim Salestrom.

We bid farewell to some longtime members of the SFL community in 2021, including Suzanne Brown, pictured here with her husband Joe on a hiking adventure. Suzanne participated in twenty-five Ski for Light events, the last in 2012; she was on the Ridderrenn team in 1997 and received the Bjarne Eikevik President's Award in 2007. Suzanne served on the Board (including a stint as Vice President), was the founding chair of the SFL Endowment committee, and was a leading fundraiser and "friend-raiser" for the organization.

Liv Markle, a guide for twenty-three years, received the SFL Brit Peterson Award for her fundraising efforts.

Art Bunn was a guide at eleven SFL events between 1994 and 2009; he served on the Board and was also a leader of the Colorado regional program, founding the summer Trek for Light, a llama-supported wilderness adventure for the visually impaired.

Asbjorn Rostad, Susan Hooker, Billie Jean Keith, Tor Dahl, Inger Moen, Robert Buchanan, and Suzanne Pedersen, widow of Olav... each made significant contributions to our program, and they are all sorely missed. Our heartfelt condolences go to the families of our departed friends.
